

CURRICULUM IN YEARS 7 AND 8



Enquiring Minds

- This unique programme allows boys to gain the practical skills needed in each subject (Geography, History and Theology, Philosophy & Religion) and to delve deeper into topics by analysing, questioning and debating their Enquiry Question in each subject per term.
- Lessons are delivered by the three Heads of Department (Geography Mrs Payne, History Mr Cramp & TPR Mrs Shanmuganathan). All are highly passionate about their subjects and have a depth of subject knowledge that allows them to focus on the development of each individual child.
- The terms are split as follows:
- Sustainability, Ethics, Conflict, Climate, Continuity and Change
- Throughout each term, students look at the connections between the subjects as well as thinking about why each Enquiry Question has been chosen. Termly projects are then submitted in a variety of different forms and assessed against a range of different skills and competencies. Students self-assess themselves against this same criteria. Students are provided with the skills that they need to succeed in the modern world. This ranges from Leadership, Collaboration, to Independent working.

Senior School Diploma

- Over Years 7 & 8 pupils should evidence all of the following to achieve their Senior School Diploma (similar to Prep School Baccalaureate)
- Independent learning
- Leadership (meeting, assembly, teaching a lesson)
- Creativity through Music, Art, Drama, ICT, writing an article for the Acorn or similar
- Social responsibility (ie charity work, commitments outside of school)
- Collaboration
- Self-awareness (reflection, target-setting)
- Life skills (ie cookery, First Aid)
- Awareness of careers and the world of work
- International understanding
- Academic excellence (progress or achievement) -evidenced in at least 5
- pieces


